- Did you review the Stage 1 (ST1) Transcription Checklist already?
 - ✓ All Stage 1 tasks must be complete **before progressing** to Stage 2
- 2. Did you complete the *remaining* metadata fields shown in the image here (in *red*)? \rightarrow \rightarrow \rightarrow
 - ✓ List out the *main verse*, *places*, *pastimes*, *persons* and the *themes* mentioned in the lecture
 - ✓ You can give as many themes as possible, but the *most important* ones should come first
- 3. Did you add meaningful sub-headings and paragraph-breaks to the transcription wherever relevant?
 - ✓ Paragraphs create *natural breaks* and *structure* to the text, which immensely helps the reader
 - ✓ The sub-headings help the reader as well as help document the main themes spoken by Maharaja
 - Relevant sub-headings may be added along with a paragraph whenever a new theme is introduced
 (e.g.: Significance of Candana Yatra, Lord Krishna lifts Govardhan hill, Lord Caitanya Visits Remuna, etc.)
 - Even if there is no change in the theme, still sub-headings can be added to aid the flow of the story
 (e.g.: Ramananda Raya instructs Lord Caitanya, Lord Caitanya hearing from Ramananda Raya, etc.)
 - ✓ Note that the sub-headings must be **bold** and **centered** (without italics, underline, or colon)
- 4. Some files that we have *presumed* are *ST1*, might in fact be *more progressed* at *ST2* or *ST3*
 - ✓ Although such mismatches are *unexpected*, your kind support to *verify the progress* is still requested
 - ✓ Listen at 1.5x or 2x speed to *quickly check* the transcription *accuracy* quality levels may vary later in lecture
 - ✓ Complete transcription to *at least* the *ST2* level; some of you may even be comfortable to progress to *ST3* level
